Dear Elders, Families and Friends of MSS,


We have been notified that an employee from Seashore Highlands Beach House (Memory Care) has been diagnosed with COVID-19. The employee is quarantined at home and is receiving appropriate care. The employee has not been on schedule for nearly a week and we pray this distance and time is enough to prevent any spread within our community. We continue to follow the CDC's criteria for return to work with all employees. We have notified public health officials and are following all recommendations provided by CMS and the Mississippi State Department of Health.

We wanted to update everyone on our current power situation. We are being told that the transmission lines in our areas were taken down as hurricane Zeta moved across the Coast. They must be repaired in order to restore power. The best estimates indicate this may take a few days to be restored. We have been told they are hoping to have power restored in our area next week. In the meantime, our generators at the Cove and East house are keeping us up and going. Everyone seems to be doing well. We are assisting the Villa residents muddle through this difficult time as best as we can. If you have a specific need or concern, please feel free to let us know. Our team will be happy to assist in any way possible.


