We have been notified that three elders from Wesley Manor have been diagnosed with COVID-19. The elders are quarantined and are receiving appropriate care.

As always, we continue to follow all guidance set forth by state and federal officials for privacy, elder care, employee safety, and efforts to stop the spread of COVID-19.

We understand there is a lot of COVID fatigue out there, but our best path forward is to follow the established protocols and limit the spread as much as possible. Ultimately, vaccination remains the best and most widely available protection against severe illness, hospitalization or death from COVID-19. We strongly encourage everyone to get vaccinated and boosted.

Wesley Manor is currently open to indoor visits, but it is important that you understand your risks before visiting. Forrest County currently has a 35.5% positivity rate for the virus. Visiting Wesley Manor during an active outbreak places visitors at an increased risk of contracting the virus, as well as potentially passing the virus on to the elders and team members. Please consider this as you make plans to visit our campus.
